NY State Senator Julia Salazar, NYC Council Members, Tiffany Cabán, Cecilia Gentili (from Pose on FX) and more will rally to end intersex genital mutilation Prominent public officials and human rights advocates will gather at St. Catherine's Park, August 7th

NEW YORK, NY -- Intersex activists, elected officials and allies will march and rally in NYC on August 7th at 2pm EST to demand an end to intersex genital mutilation at Weill Cornell Medicine.

In June, New York State passed a resolution condemning intersex genital mutilation and NYC Health + Hospitals subsequently halted un-consented surgery on intersex children network-wide. The NYC Council also passed INT. 1748-2019, requiring an education campaign for healthcare providers and parents of intersex newborns; the NY State Assembly is hearing a related bill in committee.

Despite the advancement of intersex rights in NYC public hospitals, non-consensual and medically unnecessary surgeries are still performed on intersex children daily as hospital systems like Weill Cornell profit off of harming intersex youth. Healthcare providers like Dr. Dix Poppas face no consequences for causing severe and permanent physical and psychological trauma, and survivors have no legal recourse. Activists and supporters will gather to pressure the system to end these practices and hold bad actors like Poppas accountable, meanwhile enshrining protections into law.
